

The Added-Value of the Atlantic Strategy: regional perspective



- The CPMR Atlantic Arc Commission in 2005 developed a ATLANTIC SPATIAL DEVELOPMENT SCHEME
- The CPMR Atlantic Arc Commission mobilised in 2009 to ask for an Atlantic Strategy
- Involved in the Atlantic Action Plan revision in 2017-2020 : see AAC Political Declaration

Positives:

- Share common objectives
- Showcase specificities of the Atlantic Area
- Bring attention to the blue economy
 - → Development of regional maritime strategies
- Bring together different levels of decision-making



But so far, cooperation successes were not necessarily linked with the AAP 2013-2020

- Lack of Funding, lack of assistance to project development
- Limited political ownership at different levels
- > Inefficiency of the governance structure
