Having studied at the National Oceanography Centre, UK, **Russell Arnott** went on to work as a commercial oceanographer for a number of years. Retraining to become a secondary science teacher, Russell later left formal education to work with Incredible Oceans; a marine education non-profit. Russell is currently a researcher at the University of Bath where he studies plankton dynamics. He has also stood on the board of directors for the European Marine Science Educators' Association.



**Claude Wohrer is currently** attached to the "Secretariat Général de la mer" (Secretariat general for the Sea), office of the prime minister and Chair of the Atlantic Strategic Committee as French presidency representative. Claude graduated as a doctor in ocean sciences from the university of Paris.

She has been involved in the European Integrated Maritime Policy with a specific focus on sea basin strategies (Atlantic and Mediterranean) for the last 10 years.



Ms. **Eimear Manning** represents Ireland as an All-Atlantic Ocean Youth Ambassador. She holds a masters of science in marine sustainability, and travels frequently to Miami, Florida to assist in field-based tagging expeditions for coastal sharks and stingrays. She currently works at ECO-UNESCO as an Environmental Education and Youth Coordinator.





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**François Arbellot** is a consultant specialized in marine leisure, boating, maritime events, maritime education for youth and maritime vocational training.

He has coordinated several European cooperation projects dedicated to maritime and nautical issues and has conducted several studies on the development of maritime activities, tourism and watersports in France, China and Portugal

He is General Secretary of the Atlantic Watersports Committee which coordinates in particular the Atlantic

Games event. With his company, We Atlantic, François Arbellot is the Coordinator of the Erasmus Plus European cooperation project "Atlantic Youth" (Development of maritime inclusive education at school - 5 countries - 2017-2020). He is preparing, with several partners the "Atlantic Blue School" project.



Dr. **Nóirín Burke** is the Director of Education at Galway Atlantaquaria Ltd, the National Aquarium of Ireland, where she has worked for over 12 years. She is also cosecretariat for the Irish Ocean Literacy Network www.irishoceanliteracy.ie and is a board member of the Irish Whale and Dolphin Group. She has experience working on a range of ocean related education from Montessori to adult learning including the Explorers Education Programme; creating content for formal and informal education; evaluation; and stakeholder engagement. She is the regional co-ordinator for the

BIAZA conservation education committee in Ireland and was an ambassador for the Virtual Island Submit 2020.



**Yann Leymarie** is the Head of Sports and Youth Programs for the environmental NGO Surfrider Foundation Europe. Certified PRINCE2 - Foundation Project Manager with a result-driven and detailed oriented temperament, he has been running educational projects for the past 3 years and he is now coordinating the implementation of Surfrider Europe's Ocean Literacy strategy.
