

harm from plastics




Measures should aim to:

- limit the unnecessary use of plastic;
- restrict the intentional use of microplastics;



- prevent or attenuate microplastic formation over the life-cycle of plastics and plastic-containing products;
- avoid release into the environment as near to source as possible;
- mitigate and control at key points in pathways from source to sink





- land
 - single-use plastics
 - single Use Plastics Directive EU will reduce harm from single use plastics (bans, substitutions, targets)
 - microplastics
 - some bans on microbeads in cosmetics
 - Commission Scientific Advice Mechanism highlights uncertainty
 - fibres from washing synthetic material
 - tyre wear
 - paint
- sea
 - fishing
 - producer will pay for collection, treatment and processing
 - port fees independent of quantity of litter deposited (including fished-up litter)
 - better reporting and retrieval of lost gear
 - structural funds can support port improvements
 - lost containers
