

Environmental Liability Directive



- relevant for damage to the marine environment (marine waters, protected marine species and habitats) through certain activities, including spillages of highly noxious substances during maritime transport.
- requires preventive and remedial action by the operator, including effective remediation of the baseline condition, based on the "polluter pays" principle.
- incidents covered by the international conventions on liability and compensation for shipping activities are excluded from the scope
- Highly noxious substances transported by sea will be exempt from the scope of the ELD **only once** the HNS Convention is in force.



Amended Port Reception Facilities (PRF) Directive

- Alignment with MARPOL (Annexes I, II, IV, V and VI)
- Reduction of waste from ships at sea, through a mix of incentive and enforcement measures:
 - Cost Recovery system based on the Indirect Fee;
 - Mandatory green ship scheme;
 - Dedicated inspection regime, with a risk-based approach
 - Specific focus on marine litter from ships, including waste from fishing vessels and passively fished waste. 100% indirect fee for MARPOL Annex V waste.
- Improve the management of waste from ships in ports: adequate PRF to provide for separate collection, waste reception and handling plans, electronic reporting and exchange of information
