Background information

The CISE initiative is now entering a progressive implementation phase:

2014: Mini Demonstrator project to test information exchange

2014-2016: Potential "EUCISE 2020" project funded under FP7 to implement a first large scale network

2014-2020: EMFF fundings for projects on maritime surveillance integration at national or regional level



A Handbook, for what purpose?

An important amount of information on CISE is today available in various documents:

- Pilot projects
- TAG studies
- European Commission reports

Necessary to support the implementation of CISE by providing stakeholders (national authorities, EU agencies, software developers) a single reference document.



A Handbook, for what purpose?

- Enable all maritime surveillance bodies to share a common understanding of CISE specifications
- Provide <u>practical guidance</u> to Member States for the development of cross-sectoral and cross-border information exchange.



Intended content of the Handbook

A two-fold outline, allowing different reading paths according to the user's needs:

- <u>Exhaustive description</u> of the CISE concept specifications, covering every interoperability layer: legal, organisational, semantic and technical.
- <u>Practical procedures</u> answering operational questions.



Intended content of the Handbook

Part 1 - Full description of CISE interoperability specifications:

- <u>Legal</u>: guidelines to ensure compliance with EU and national legislations
- <u>Organisational</u>:cooperation between Member-States, access rights policy, management of CISE data model
- Semantic: CISE data model
- <u>Technical</u>: network, interconnection, error handling



Intended content of the Handbook

Part 2 - Practical procedures:

Non-exhaustive list of questions:

- How to identify the various information services made available by CISE participants?
- Where to find an updated list of CISE participants?
- How to set up an information exchange with another maritime authority?
- To whom should I address in case of IT failures?

Proposed agenda and working method

Release of the Handbook by end 2015/beginning 2016.

Drafting by DG MARE, with contribution of TAG and MSEG on the successive versions.

Other inputs:

- BlueMassMed, Marsuno, CoopP, Demonstrator, TAG studies
- Potential EUCISE 2020 project (2014/2016)



Next steps

Issues deserving further work with a specific contribution from MSEG:

- <u>Identification of best practices at national level</u>: data protection, coordination mechanisms, assessment of cross-sectoral information needs, existing information exchanges.
- <u>European directory of maritime surveillance authorities</u> and information services: requirements for its creation and maintenance.
- Future management of CISE whithin MS authorities.
- Others?
