Information on the Assistance Mechanism for the implementation of MSP

The objective of the contract is to provide assistance to Member States regarding the implementation of MSP.

To this end the following tasks are foreseen:

- Primarily, the contractors will generate and disseminate useful information on the implementation of MSP via a focal point service in each of the five European sea-basins and one central dedicated MSP website. Information will include samples of practices and tools for implementing requirements of the MSP Directive as well as available funding instruments.
- Additionally, based upon needs identified by Member States and the Commission, the contractors will conduct technical studies to reduce knowledge gaps. The study to be undertaken this year will deal with the evaluation of data and knowledge gaps to implement MSP.
- Furthermore, the contractors will provide support to prepare, facilitate and document MSEG meetings and MSP-related conferences.
