Understanding skills


- more than qualifications: "soft", digital, "green"

 - meaningfully synthesised and analysed to support decisions
- Relevant, reliable, updated, accessible
- Skills assessment and anticipation: support decision making



Why the Skills Panorama?

The **Skills Panorama** is an initiative of the European Commission to improve **transparency** on the European labour market by providing **online access** to data and research findings on *skills and labour market prospects* at both national and EU level



Navigating the **Skills Panorama**

Dashboards: country, occupation, sector, indicators

Analytical highlights: up-to-date succinct analysis about a skill, a group of skills, a sector, an occupation or a country

Useful resources: quick access to documents, websites, glossaries and any other relevant sources

Blog: learn directly from experts on skills, share their insights and offer your views on various skills-related topics

News and Events: the most recent news/developments in the field of skills in Europe

- Users' satisfaction survey: policy makers, but also career guidance counsellors








Next steps
