Background

- Integrated maritime Policy (major policy for all EU institutions)
- Progress Report on the implementation of IMP
 - Priorities: (1) integration of maritime governance
 - (2) development of cross-cutting policy tools
 - (3) definition of boundaries of sustainability
 - (4) development of sea-basin strategies
 - (5) development of international dimension of the IMP
 - (6) renewed focus on sustainable growth, employment and innovation
- Barroso II Commission policy priorities EU 2020
 - Issues: economic growth & employment, international competitiveness, ageing population
 - Objectives: Smart, Sustainable and Inclusive Growth



Council conclusions on sea basins

- Continue ... to implement ... elaborate ... further comprehensive strategy for growth, jobs and sustainability ... with due respect to subsidiarity and proportionality and ... strong involvement of stakeholders;
- further develop strategic approaches to regional sea basins where there is a demand and a perspective of clear added value, taking into account the experience so far





Challenges for the Atlantic

- A definition for the Atlantic Area (geographical issues, maritime perspective)
- Coherent economic development (blue jobs, cross-border dimension)
- Sustainability of maritime activities (in line with MFSD Marine knowledge, MSP)
- Connectivity (transport, energy grid, high speed internet)
- Human dimension (maritime heritage, employment)
- Maritime governance (multi-layer interaction, cross-border co-operation)
- International dimension (trans-Atlantic partners, Outermost Regions)

- Consultation
 - Interservice group working scheme
 - Member States consultation (ES, FR, IE, PT, UK)
 - CPRM Atlantic Arc
 - Regional stakeholders
 - On-line consultation (fores en June –September 2010)
- Time-line adoption 1st quarter 2011
