The overall aim of 'Turning Blue' project is to create new cooperation mechanisms and training materials on sustainable blue economy to inspire and engage disadvantaged young people serving time in prison (16-30 years old) to pursue a sustainable 'blue career' in one of the Blue Economy sectors.



Objectives

- Identify 30 types of jobs in the Blue Economy with a high potential to employ young people leaving prison, and the needed professional competencies (including
- Design an Awareness Training on Blue Economy careers
- Design an integrated "from prison to the blue economy" intervention model, and train professionals in it
- Form the 'Turning Blue' Network (prison services, education/training providers and blue industry operators)

- Set-up a **job-placement platform** to connect young people leaving prison and Blue Economy operators
- Deliver **5 national seminars**, **2 EU Webinars** and **1 EU Conference**, involving more than 350 participants.
- Boost collaboration opportunities between different stakeholders from blue economy, higher education, justice and civil society organisations, and create new knowledge to inform policies at different levels.



Main Indicators

- 25 job placements and retentions
- 30 blue job profiles
- 1 'Turning Blue' Awareness Training
 - Tested with 84 young people in prison
 - 28 professionals trained in it
- 1 job-matching platform
- 1 transition model
 - 40 professionals trained in it
- 1 'Turning Blue' Mentorship Programme
 - 40 blue industry professionals trained in it
- 1 Turning Blue Network with at least 30 members
- 5 national events (150 stakeholders involved);
- 2 EU Webinars (100 participants);
- 1 Final Conference (at least 100 participants from different EU countries)
