definitions

- Ocean observations”
 - all observations of the state and dynamics of oceans and of marine organisms made within and beyond the jurisdiction of EU Member States, **with the exception of observations made from Earth-orbiting satellites**
- “Ocean waters”
 - all salty and brackish waters as well as the underlying seabed and subsoil



problems

- inefficient planning
 - made for a specific purpose by a specific user community
- opaque planning
 - unaware of plans of neighbours
- insufficient sharing.
 - sharing of these assets could allow more observations for the same money
- insufficient innovation
 - take-up of new platforms and sensors slow;
- unsustainable observation –
 - precarious funding
- inequitable sharing of effort
 - for participation in international programmes
- lack of standards
 - inhibits citizen science

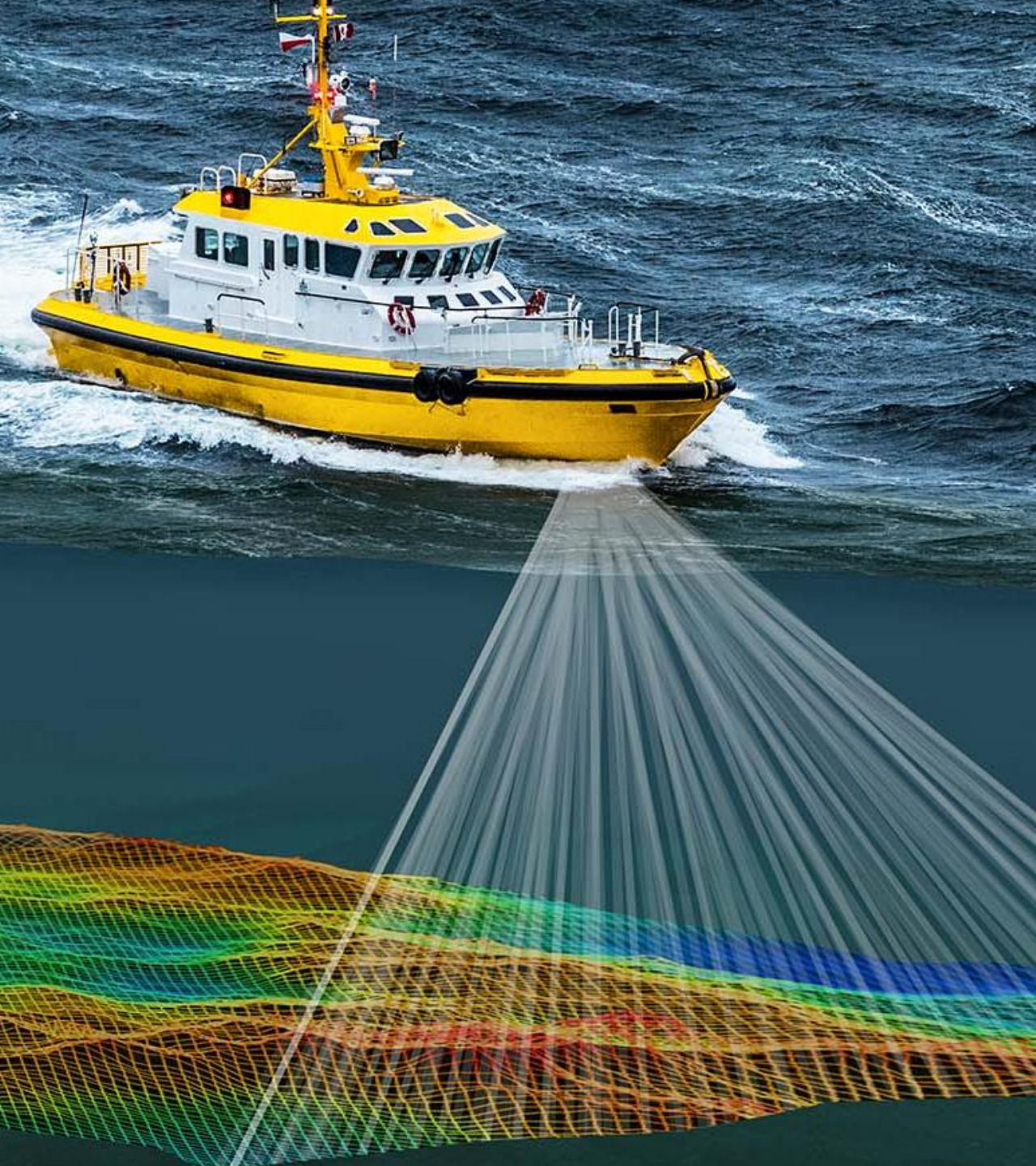
proportion of replies
