

#### Map of the month

#### **Ocean energy**

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
Europe's marine regions offer vast renewable energy resources, which can be harvested through a number of different technologies. Most notable are offshore wind farms. Energy can also be harvested from the waves, tides and salinity and temperature differences (gradients) throughout the seawater. Learn about wind farms, ocean energy projects and test sites in European waters.



#### Map of the month

#### **Seabed habitats**

There are many different types of seabed habitats in Europe's seas, from coral reefs in the North-east Atlantic Ocean to seagrass meadows in coastal waters. Protecting the seabed is important for preserving marine biodiversity. The map of the month shows the classified biological zones used in the EUSeaMap model, which helps determine habitat types. Biological zones are determined based on physical variables and proxies.

#### Monthly dive into the European Atlas of the Seas

A new <u>video tutorial</u> has been released on the Atlas' measure tool which shows how users can measure distances and estimate surface areas in the Atlas as well as see the geographical coordinates for any location on a map. A great help to resolve the geocaching game, treasure hunt and boat races in the Teachers Corner! In February, four 'Maps of the Week' were published on the Maritime Forum and the EMODnet website: 'World Wetlands Day, Rivers and Marine Natura 2000 sites', 'Marine habitats and biodiversity conservation', 'Plastic Pollution and Seabed Litter' and 'Ensuring Sustainability in Fisheries'.

In March, the European Atlas of the Seas' team contributed to the Ocean Literacy in Action conference and exhibition organised in the framework of the European Ocean Days and the EU4OCEAN Science Projects Online Workshop (SPOW) on Plastic Pollution and Working with Ocean Technology. The team organised a workshop in Dutch for pupils in the fifth grade of primary school at the De Plataan school in Merchtem (Belgium). The Atlas poster was featured at the VLIZ Marine Science Day and the "Where next for Europe's Seas" event. Five 'Maps of the Week' were published on the Maritime Forum and the EMODnet website: 'European Ocean Days - Mission Restore our Ocean & Waters Forum', 'EU4Ocean - Ocean Literacy in Action', 'Regional Sea Conventions', 'World Water Day - Cooperation towards sustainable management of water and peace' and 'International Day of Zero Waste'.


