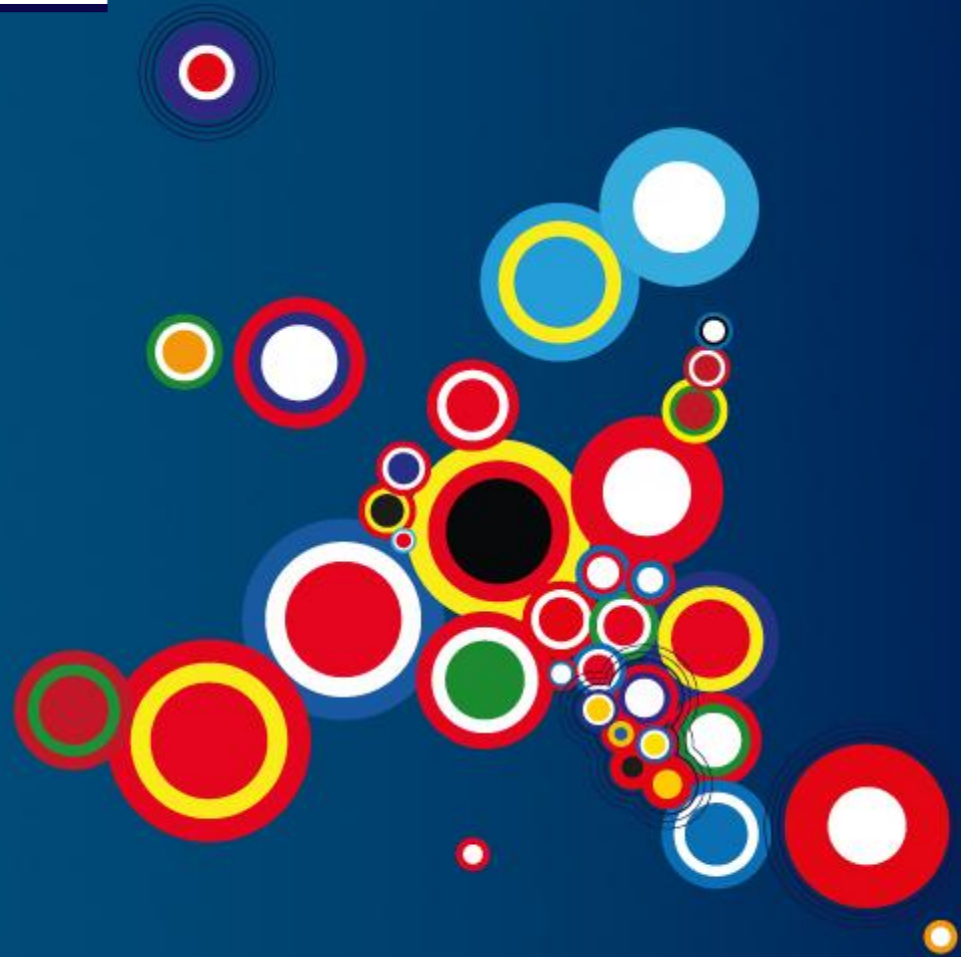

Country Strategy Papers (CSPs)

- ✓ What are CSPs?
 - Second level strategic planning doc. for IPA II
(also: Multi-Country Strategy Paper)
- ✓ What are they targeting?
 - Priorities / reform efforts for the entire 7-year period
(with mid-term review)
- ✓ Prepared under DG ELARG lead, in consultation with other IPA DGs and in partnership with beneficiaries



Guiding principles for IPA II

- ✓ Builds on IPA I (2007 – 2013)
- ✓ Reinforced link between financial assistance and policy agenda
- ✓ Stronger ownership by the beneficiaries
- ✓ Core themes remain good governance and capacity building
- ✓ Contribution to the objectives of EU 2020 Agenda / SEE 2020 Strategy



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Sector approach: main objectives

- ✓ Promotes policy dialogue and structural reform, while empowering national authorities and enabling tighter links between Enlargement policy objectives and financial assistance
- ✓ Allows to move towards a more targeted & focused assistance
- ✓ Allows to better demonstrate the impact and results of limited financial resources (value added of IPA)



Programmes – an overview

- Policy areas and sectors defined within the Country Strategy Papers (CSPs)
- Identification of priority sectors by beneficiaries with EC support according to:
 - National strategies
 - Relevance for EU accession
 - Relevance for national socio-economic development
- CSPs currently under preparation: they will serve as basis for the country / multi-country programmes that will have to be adopted not later than end 2014
- Programme architecture under discussion

List of sectors to be used in CSPs

1. Governance and public administration reform
2. Justice, home affairs and fundamental rights
3. Environment
4. Transport
5. Energy
6. Competitiveness and innovation
7. Education, employment and social policies
8. Agriculture and rural development
9. Cross-border cooperation and regional cooperation

- Country Strategy Papers: Q2-Q3 2014
- Framework agreements: Q2-Q3 2014
