









## Seabed habitats: scope

- Until 2021, EMODnet Seabed Habitats has focussed on "marine habitats":
  - Directly connected to the ocean
  - Includes everything from spring high tide mark downwards
  - Includes reduced and variable salinity waters
- From 2021, also includes "coastal habitats":
  - Characterised by proximity to the sea but not permanently or tidally inundated
  - E.g. sand dunes, sea cliffs and beaches

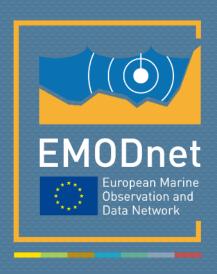
