Priorities and opportunities



Needs and applications from EMODnet Data

- (1) Salinity data for use in scrubber;
- (2) Data to identify "same risk areas" (invasive species)
- (3) **Legal disclaimer** on the use of data (e.g. to exclude liability of companies for the use of data submitted by them);
- (4) Ship density maps
- (5) Accurate map of all oil and gas installations;
- (6) **Weather forecast data** (wave highs, storm surges, etc.) to apply safety measures for offshore activities;
- (7) Showcase how EMODnet benefit for **MSFD implement**ation and regional sea conventions obligations;
- (8) Cumulative impact assessment
- (9) **Decommissioning**
- (10) Underwater noise
- (11) Port reception facility for waste visualisation of
